
Access Public transport: to Baden railway station, The route to the event

parks to the event centre is not marked.



Anti-doping The current anti-doping rules of Swiss Olympic apply to this compe-

tition. Doping checks can be carried out with any participant. Entering the competition implies acceptance of the Swiss Olympic antidoping rules. In the classes D/H20 and D/HE only those who have signed the declaration of acceptance of the doping rules can start.

Prestart There is room for warming up.

Start signal:

Late starters should report to the prestart.

Start Start time -4 min.: Call-up, clear and check of SI card

Start time -3 min.: Control descriptions: IOF symbols, self-service

Start time -2 min.: Display of arrangement of map boxes

Start time -1 min.: SI card start check, then access to map box

The map may only be taken once the start signal

has been given. It is the runner's responsibility to ensure they take the right map.

70 m after the start line (control without SI unit). Start point:

The route to the start point is compulsory.

Start open classes Report to the open class start 4 minutes before the start time. The maps will be opened by a helper immediately before the start time.

The start time is triggered by the participant at the start line.

Courses

Courses and control descriptions are printed on the map.

Various classes have a "map flip" and have to turn over the map during the race. The last control on the front side corresponds to the start point on the rear side of the map.

In accordance with the wishes of Swiss Orienteering for this world ranking event H20 runs the same course as HE and D20 the same as DE.

A slightly longer winning time (about 40 minutes) is expected for the HE/H20 course.

Punching system

SPORTident, the contactless AIR+ function is active.

Terrain

Mittelland forest with relatively few brambles. Green stripes usually represent fallen trees (see below).

The area can be split into three sections:

A moderate slope to the west has few contour details and is generally very runnable.

The north east slope down to the Limmat river is very varied and rich in detail.

In between lies the Tüfels-Chäller ("Devil's cellar"). This area has a very varied topography and is very detailed with a combination of re-entrants, hills, knolls, depressions and steep slopes that can be very slippery in wet conditions. In the central part there are a lot of stones, boulders and cliffs of up to 20 metres in height.

Notes on fallen trees and ground vegetation

The Tüfels-Chäller is a forest reserve and some areas fallen trees lie on the ground. These have been mapped as follows:

Symbol 407 vegetation, slow running, good visibility

409 vegetation: walk, good visibility

This symbol is also used for brambles. Thanks to the winter snow these are generally rather flat and are normally not a great obstacle.

When fallen trees are very difficult or impossible to cross the symbol **410 vegetation: fight** is used, i.e. 100% green.

Controls

The controls are to be taken in the prescribed order. Some are close to each other, so check the codes. Punch the controls with the SI card. If AIR+ does not work (empty battery in the SI card), place the card in the hole on the SI unit. If the unit does not function (no acoustic or optical signal), or if the unit is missing, punch the map with the needle punch. In this case, inform the helpers at the

finish, write your name on the map and hand it over to the helper. Also inform the helper at the SI read out point at the event centre.

Out of bounds areas The out of bounds areas that are marked on the map may not be

entered. A particularly sensitive out of bounds area will be taped off

in the forest.

Finish Record the finish time by contactless punching of the finish SI-unit.

The maps do not have to be handed in, but may not be shown to runners that have not yet started (fairness). Distance from finish to

event centre 400 m.

SI card read-out Everyone who has started must report to the SI read-out station in

the event centre shortly before the entrance to the changing rooms.

Please do this immediately after arrival.

The finish closes 90 minutes after the last start
